

Privacy Statement – Lana Murphy

I am a self-employed barrister at Albion Chambers.

I accept instructions from firms of solicitors, and government or regulatory bodies. For example, the Crown Prosecution Service and the Health and Safety Executive.

The clerking team at Albion Chambers handle most of my instructions with regard to the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). If you have any questions about this statement or about how your personal data is managed/handled, please do contact me via the clerking team.

Privacy – the law

I am permitted to use your personal data provided I have a lawful reason for its use. It can be for one or more of the following reasons:

- 1) You give consent
- 2) To perform/fulfil a contract I have with you
- 3) To comply with a legal obligation/duty
- 4) For a legitimate interest

I may receive or use special categories of personal data which includes information that reveals racial/ethnic origin, political opinions, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, trade union membership, biometric data, health data and criminal records.

I must have your consent to process/use your personal data to accept and carry out your instructions.

Use of personal data

When instructed as a barrister, I will use personal data to represent you and your interests.

My practice is varied across crime, employment and public law reviews. I principally practice in crime. The data I often receive/use includes personal details; witness statements; exhibits such as phone data, photographs, recordings, footage, health/medical records, expert/forensic reports, interviews; previous convictions; and advices/opinions.

Most multimedia material I receive will be shared with me via a secure link and saved onto the file on OneDrive.

Sharing, storing & disposing of personal data

The clerking team act as 'data processors' and will receive most of the data/material I am sent. It is then stored on the respective case file on OneDrive.

Infrequently, I may receive physical data via my clerks – this will be securely locked in Chambers. There may be occasions when I need to take this material home and it will be handled the same and safely locked away.

I will sometimes need to share personal data with barristers at Albion Chambers such as when a hearing is covered by a colleague, or those from other chambers. This will require the consent of those instructing.

You are entitled to decide not to give me your personal information and can choose to withdraw your consent at any time. However, I may have to withdraw from continuing to represent you if this means, for example, I cannot perform the contract I have with you or if stops me from complying with a legal/professional obligation.

You can ask my clerks for a copy of, or records that I hold of, your personal data.

I have to keep documents in a case for a minimum of seven years and after this, the material will be disposed of securely.
